

No fault RHD accident statement

May 21st 2006 2:20am
White Ave. & 104th street Edmonton.
1989 Land Cruiser RHD

I drove from Canmore Alberta to Edmonton at 12:30am May 21st.

As we are casually driving down White Avenue at 40 km/h (it is raining lightly), the bars clubs and pubs are just closing. It is a hockey playoff night and the streets are very agitated with large crowds of people cheering yelling and mostly intoxicated.

As we approach 104th street I see a woman standing in my lane, I moved over to miss her but since there are cars in the left lane I could not change lanes completely. My concentration was on the lady standing in my lane and I see another woman running in front of the truck. She was approximately 2 feet in front of my vehicle wearing black clothes and black wig, she blended into the night. She got hit at about 30 km/h and her black wig hits my windshield only to roll down and remain on my hood. I came to a stop, turned on my hazards and pulled my emergency brake.

I accompany a police officer into his van and write the witness report on the scene, which was matched to other driver's reports. I spent 6 hours on scene in a police van until accident reconstruction unit arrive on scene to take over the investigation.

The vehicle was towed for mechanical inspection and impounded for 5 to 6 days. The vehicle was inspected and no mechanical deficiencies were found. The unit was in excellent mechanical condition.

I, Paul-Etienne Hery, was not found at fault.
Driver error was not found.
Mechanical deficiencies were not found
